This session will include key things to look out for as a sign that a friend, client or colleague may be involved with a loan shark.

The session will also show the impact that illegal lenders have on victims and communities and how we can work together to stop people falling into the clutches of criminals.

Home Energy Advice Service Thanet District Council



Thanet District Council has a dedicated Home Energy Advice Service and you are now able to refer clients directly to them via ReferKent.

They can offer advice free of charge to all Thanet residents, whether they own their home, rent from a private landlord, through the council or Housing Association and regardless of their financial situation.

They can:

- 1. Give information on home energy grants that are available for home insulation, heating and to generate energy.
- 2. Support with energy and other household debts
- 3. Give advice on ways to save money on energy bills
- 4. Offer advice on renewable energy and the schemes available
- 5. Signpost to other relevant community services and schemes, and much more


- Umbrellas have gone to a charity supporting people with complex mental health needs.
